Clauses end with a semicolon

Reminders

- Sponsor= author of resolution
- Signatories= countries agreeing to discuss/vote on resolution
- Clauses are general
- Semicolons are used at the end of each clause
- End with a period after final clause
- Amendments can be added to adjust resolution while drafting
- Authorship speeches prior to voting
