## How to write operative (proposed actions) clauses

You must ensure that your proposals are actually workable and that they fully reflect the existing policies of the country or agency that you represent.

- Sponsor= author of resolution
- Signatories = countries agreeing to discuss/vote on resolution
- Clauses are general
- > Semicolons are used at the end of each clause
- End with a period after final clause
- Amendments can be added to adjust resolution while drafting
- Authorship speeches prior to voting
